
Contest Rules:

5th Grade students must create a poster demonstrating the theme "Bringing Our Missing Children Home."

1. The finished poster must be 8 ½ x 14 inches.
2. The slogan, "Bringing Our Missing Children Home," must appear somewhere on the poster.
3. Posters must be created by hand. Posters with printed images, collages, and stamping are not eligible.
4. Posters should be original in design. Be creative! Use acrylics, watercolor, pencil, charcoal, magic markers, spray paint, crayons, pastels, etc.

6. The poster must be submitted with a completed application, which includes a description of the poster and a brief biography of the artist.


