Notice to KBOC Establishments within Adult Care Homes and Long-Term Care Units of Medical Care Facilities

6/30/2023

Dear Licensees:

HB 2125 exempts adult care homes, as defined in K.S.A. 39-923, and long-term care units of medical care facilities, as defined in K.S.A. 65-425, from:

- Making application to establish a salon or clinic with the Board of Cosmetology;
- Paying the new salon or clinic license fee;
- Submitting to inspection of equipment as to safety and sanitary condition of the premises; and
- Holding a salon or clinic license as issued by the Board of Cosmetology

This law becomes effective July 1, 2023. If there is current KBOC establishment licensure within adult care homes or long-term care units of medical care facilities, you will no longer be required to hold a KBOC establishment license after 6/30/2023. You can read the full legislation <u>here</u>.
